



Do you wish that you could save water in your landscape?

As residential watering restrictions are being implemented county wide, we want to remind you to adjust your timers in order to comply with current watering restrictions. Most water districts have implemented a 3 day per week by 10 minute maximum per cycle. However, if you have water saving devices installed in your system such as drip irrigation, rotary style nozzles, or a weather-based timer, you do not have to comply with these restrictions.

We are currently offering several promotions that will help you conserve water and save you money. Many of these upgrades also qualify for rebates ([www.bewaterwise.com](http://www.bewaterwise.com)). Most residences will qualify for up to \$230-\$300 per household.

1. Consider an irrigation tune-up. This would include the repair of broken heads, straighten leaning sprinkler heads, and adjust sprinklers that are overthrowing walks or pathways.
2. Replace spray heads with stream rotary nozzles. They save 30% on mist and will lower the sprinkler precipitation rate, which reduces run-off and allows deeper root penetration. The best part is you will receive a \$4 per nozzle rebate.
3. Install weather sensors. This will prevent the irrigation system from turning on in the rain or heavy winds, or when the soil is still wet.
4. Install a 2" layer of mulch. This will help keep moisture in the ground and also acts as an organic fertilizer. Most yards require 2-4 yards of mulch at the rate of \$93 per yard.
5. Convert or upgrade your existing timer to a evapotranspiration based controller. These units continually gather on-site solar and temperature data to calculate watering requirements. Weather based irrigation controllers are exempt from the mandatory water scheduling in addition to producing considerable water savings. We currently recommend the Hunter Solar Sync System. Most installations will cost \$550 for the upgrade but you will receive a \$230 rebate to help offset the costs.
